HAZARDOUS MATERIALS IN THE HOME:

A ROOM-BY-ROOM ANALYSIS

azardous materials are all around us--asbestos, chlorine, gasoline, bleach, pesticides, propane--the list goes on and on. Hazardous materials and the products produced by them have greatly contributed to our high standard of living. They are part of our society. Everyday, people buy products that are dangerous if misused. They use the product and then store any that is left over. Many of the chemicals used in the home are innocuous products, but when unleashed in a fire, they can become mixed and create a variety of hazards for firefighters.

This article will address where these hazardous materials are likely to be located and what dangers could be encountered when fighting that "typical" house or garage fire. The hazardous materials I mention are not exotic and are not stored in large quantities. The average person, even firefighters, may unknowingly violate basic safety rules when encountering these substances.

Danger of Complacency

The industrial and commercial communities are bound by many rules and Right-to-Know laws governing chemicals and their use, storage, markings, labeling and handling. These regulations are used to provide for the safe handling, storage and proper emergency procedures of hazardous materials.

Fortunately, firefighters have the basic skills and knowledge to help them recognize and identify hazard-

ous materials at a typical Haz-Mat incident. However, at a typical house or garage fire or emergency, the average firefighter may not realize or recognize that these substances may be encountered. We should not fall into complacency regarding responses to private dwellings or garages since many homes and garages may double as in-house businesses and contain more exotic chemicals in larger quantities, such as pool supplies, building and roofing materials and laundry and home detergents, to name a few.

Most Dangerous Room

Your unit arrives at a fully involved house or garage fire. Is it an ordinary fire or a Haz-Mat incident? Be aware of these most dangerous rooms at your next house fire. (See following.)

Haz-Mat Lesson

We all know that the nature of firefighting is very dangerous and dynamic. We also know that firefighters are action-oriented and perform extraordinary tasks under extraordinary conditions. A casual or routine approach to any household fire can lead to injury or death. Hazardous materials in the home are a real danger and can also result in long-term chronic health problems. The proper use of personal protective clothing and a common sense approach are required. It is better to err on the side of SAFETY!

SPECIAL APPARATUS

FDR Drive Response Apparatus

FDR Response Unit 1 is quartered with and staffed by Engine 16. It carries 200 gallons of water, a 105-gpm pump, hose, portable extinguishers and hand tools.

rom time to time, the Department is faced with providing fire protection under unusual circumstances. This has been the case on the FDR Drive for several years, due to long-term reconstruction that has imposed height and/or weight restrictions in certain areas, limiting the use of conventional apparatus.

Initially, a spare suburban, carrying portable extinguishers and hand tools, was assigned to provide this protection. This proved inadequate and a brush fire unit was reassigned as an additional apparatus to Engine 16 for FDR responses. While this provided a solution to the problem, the reassignment of the brush fire unit left a void on Staten Island, especially during the brush fire seasons.

To rectify this, the Department purchased two flatbed trucks and mounted firefighting modules on them. These modules, originally constructed for brush fire operations, have 200-gallon tanks, a booster reel and small pumps. The pumps are rated at 105 gallons per minute at 50-psi pressure, with all controls located at the rear of the apparatus. These units also carry additional hose (to stretch a hand- or supply-line), portable extinguishers and hand tools. The two vehicles are designated FDR Response Units 1 and 2 and are quartered with Engines 16 and 39, respectively.

Currently, a conventional apparatus is restricted from entering the FDR Drive between 23rd and 63rd Streets. For alarms on the FDR Drive within this area, the normal assignment responds. An engine and ladder company respond to the nearest highway entrances north and south of the reported incident and await orders. For incidents north of 34th Street, both FDR Response Units are assigned, while incidents south of 34th Street receive only one FDR Response Unit.

The personnel from Engines 16 and 39 staff the FDR Response Units. The officer and chauffeur respond in the FDR Response Apparatus, followed by a suburban with the remainder of the unit's firefighters. The unit's regular apparatus is left in quarters. The suburban carries an assortment of portable extinguishers,

including carbon dioxide, Purple-K and water, as well as absorbent material. The FDR Response Unit always responds first and, at the scene, the suburban is used to block traffic and create a safety zone for operating forces. Once the location of the incident is established, the regularly assigned units will attempt to reach the scene through local streets, if necessary.

If it becomes necessary to augment the water supply of an FDR Response Unit, the officer will advise the dispatcher of the nearest location that a regular engine company is to be directed. This location can be from either a nearby service road or a point above or below the highway.


Special equipment, such as Hurst tools, may need to be transported by battalion or Bureau of EMS vehicles, carried up aerial ladders or lifted in a tower-ladder basket. The officer of the FDR Response Unit advises the dispatcher of the most appropriate method.

Engine companies relocated into either Engine 16 or 39 staff the FDR Response Units as required.

Since the vast majority of incidents on this highway are either automobile fires or vehicular accidents, they are within the capabilities of the FDR Response Units. When necessary, they are supported by additional units assigned on the first alarm. The FDR Response Units are prime examples of how the Department modifies operational procedures to adapt to changing conditions to provide necessary fire protection to the public.







ELEVATOR FREE-FALL

n October 14, 1996, at 0614 hours, units from Battalion 18 responded to a building fire at 1245 Stratford Avenue. Upon arrival, units found tenants exiting the building and reporting heavy smoke on the upper floors. The building was a six-story, "H"-type, non-fireproof multiple dwelling, 125 x 100 feet. Ladder 58 confirmed the smoke on the upper floors and its members found a fire in the elevator shaft on the fourth floor. There was a mattress burning in the elevator car located on the fourth floor. As Engine 45 was stretching its line, other units were busy venting the upper floors and searching for trapped occupants, who may have exited their apartments and become disoriented. When the charged line was in place, L-58 began forcing the shaftway door. The door was warped, causing a momentary delay in gaining entry. This proved to be an unexpected benefit, for when the door was opened, the elevator fell to the basement without warning. Engine 82 stretched its line to the basement and extinguished the fire. There were some other areas of the shaft that needed extinguishment, but they were taken care of quickly.

To fully understand what caused the elevator car to free-fall to the pit, I contacted the Buildings Department. Later that day, I met with a representative of Buildings and a private elevator repairman, who had been hired by the building owner. Both the elevator inspector and the elevator repairman agreed that the cause of the car failure and free-fall was the melting of

the "babbitt." All elevators have these shackles and when subjected to the heat of a fire, the lead that holds the babbitt can melt. This is exactly what happened at this fire.

Besides the melting of the babbitt, the safety or governor--although tripped--did not cause the brakes to stop the car. The Building Department tested the governor and determined that the babbitt attached to the cable holding the governor also melted from the heat of the fire.

A very valuable lesson was learned at this fire. Whenever an elevator car has been subjected to fire, do not enter or straddle the car to extinguish or overhaul. Always operate from the safety of the landing or hallway. If the elevator car has been subjected to a significant fire, issue an order to the building owner or representative to have the elevator tested by a licensed elevator repairman before restoring it to service. Also forward an A-8 to the Buildings Department's Elevator Division.

On July 12, 1997, an elevator car at 2055 Anthony Avenue (Bronx Box 124) failed under similar conditions and fell to the basement. Fire was in the elevator car located on the lobby level, with extension into the shaft.


