**Bronx Box 44-4841, 4055 White Plains Road/East 229th Street, October 19, 2020. A long-established cycle shop and small grocery store were consumed by fire on the night of October 19th in the Wakefield section of the Upper Bronx. At 2018 hours, a phone alarm was received for a reported fire in a motorcycle shop at 4055 White Plains Road. On arrival, the All Hands was transmitted for fire throughout a 75- by 100-foot bicycle shop. Members made a push as truck members opened the roof. An additional engine and truck were called for, followed by a second alarm at 2023 hours. Conditions continued to deteriorate and at 2043 hours, all members were ordered off the roof. A third alarm was transmitted as operations transitioned to defensive mode. Flames extended to a small, one-story grocery store on East 228th Street. To prevent extension, hand-lines were stretched into exposure #3, a five-story, brick, occupied multiple dwelling and to exposure #4, a three-story, brick, occupied multiple dwelling. Eventually, three tower ladders, three hand-lines and two multiversals were used on the fire. A fourth alarm was transmitted at 2229 hours for additional resources as members were switched out. The fire continued to be darkened down until the probably will hold was transmitted at 2249 hours and under control transmitted at 0052 hours on October 20th. The bicycle store and grocery were completely destroyed. All exposures were undamaged. No injuries were reported and the cause has not been determined. Photo and copy by Bill Tompkins.**







**Bronx Box 44-2994, 1959 Jerome Avenue, July 1, 2020. A quickly escalating fire damaged or destroyed three commercial buildings on congested Jerome Avenue in the Bronx on July 1, 2020. Engine 75 arrived at 1959 Jerome Avenue shortly after 2 a.m. to find heavy smoke venting from a two-story, 185- by 100-foot taxpayer, with an auto repair shop on the first floor and a parking garage on the second. The All Hands was transmitted at 2:08 a.m. for several cars burning in the parking garage. Access and visibility were limited as companies advanced several lines to hit the flames. The fire continued to spread and at 2:19 a.m., a second alarm was transmitted. The flames soon extended to the roof area and at 2:30 a.m., a third alarm was transmitted by Division 7. Conditions continued to deteriorate and all members were ordered off the roof and the incident became a defensive operation. A Mayday was sounded for a collapse of the rear wall, but that was quickly cleared. The fire spread to both the B and D exposures, prompting a fourth alarm. Eventually, seven tower ladders were operating, as well as several multiversals. Companies were able to work around the elevated subway tracks that ran in front of the fire building. The fire was declared Probably Will Hold at 5:11 a.m. and placed Under Control at 11:46 a.m. Several units remained for a watch line. No serious injuries were reported.
