

.1700 TO 2300...WIDELY SCATTERED LIGHT RAIN SHOWERS IN CENTRAL OKLAHOMA WILL DISSIPATE BY 1830...WITE ONLY TRACE AMOUNTS OF RAINFALL. THE CHANCE OF ADDITIONAL RAIN IN DOWNTOWN OKLAHOMA CITY IS LESS THAN 10 PERCENT THIS EVENING. NO THUNDERSTORMS ARE ANTICIPATED IN THE AREA. WINDS WILL BE WEST TO MORTHWEST AT 10 MPH...OR LESS. 

#### FEMA IST MEDICAL REPORT 4/24/95 1800H

CDC and OSHA consultants have surveyed the entire site with Dr. Ho, Dr. Barbera, and Dr. Meningus (Oklahoma City EMS Director) as well as State Public Health officials. CDC officials will be continuing a comprehensive biohazar d evaluation and this information will be made available as it is received by this office. FEMA Task Force Hazmat personel report the most concentrated area of free asbestos is in the East stairwell where a number of firedoors were destroyed by the blast.

Dr. Ben Ho arrived at 1500 hours 4/23/95 and will be working as IST Medical support and will additionally be addressing developing public health concerns. Dr. Barbera will be returning to the east coast later today.

Human decon with dilute lysol is now localized to exit sites at North-west and South-east of the incident site. Task force physicians are still to make the determination of need for Task Force member decon on an individual basis.

Animal decontamination should be initiated with three wading pools at a site to be determined in consultation with Dr. Jean Hooks (Fairfax Task Force). A major decontamination center with warm water has been set up for canines in the basement of the Federal Courts Building. Dr. John McGuire (local vetrinarian) along with Oklahoma Hazmat Specialist and IST Medical personel rigged hose to a shower head for rinsing canines after anti-bacterial and anti-viral shampooing which the local vet on duty will have in his cache.

Cardizem SR and Allupent inhalers were supplied by local EMS services to USAR teams. Team members need to remind task force members that they should always be prepared with one week of personal medications in future mobilizations.

IST Medical Support requests that all Task Force members NOT take advantage of free OTC medications supplied by the local relief groups. Team physicians need to keep track of all new medication use by Task Force Team members.

Dr. Meningus has requested that local physicians NOT be available in Red Cross Stations on site as he has arranged for ACLS/BLS ambulance stations (West, East, South of structure) to transport injured to local hospitals directly. BLS medication for 75 acute casualties will be available at these sites.



- 8. Calculate remaining debris, about 3300 c.y. on south side up to third. 1 dumpster about = 25 c.y. About 130+ dumpsters.




